# General Advice

#### Working with an editor

- Building a relationship takes time
- Lots to learn from rejections and edits

#### Impact on career

- Op Eds get a broad and distinct readership than academic work
- Can lead to interesting conversations and opportunities

#### Working it into a research calendar

- Think on ideas and build a framework
- Work quickly when writing

# General Advice

### Is it Op-Ed worthy?

- Never know till you try!
- Rejection is part of the process

#### Including theory in your writing

- Rarely included in the way you would for a specialist audience
- But, broad concepts can be very transferable

#### **Promotion and career advancement**

- Op-Eds don't seem to be credited the same as peer-reviewed publications
- But, they can be a form of "soft power"
- Also, can be cited as knowledge translation or "Creative Professional Activity"
